IO opened meeting at 9:02

IO welcomed participants

IO Lets start with checking CRISP members present in the call.

AB, CN, EB, JS MA, NN, PR and NS were present at the start of the call.

1. Agenda Review

IO reviewed agenda content.

No other items were added to the agenda.

2. Actions Review

- Suggested text by Michael (global PDP)
- Suggested text by Andrei (Review Committee)

IO both actions are done.

IO actual content of the suggested text for Review Committee is Andres no Andrei.

IO asked GV to show the Michael's suggested text in the WebEx platform.

GV displayed section III of the document page 8.

IO asked MA to explained the changes.

MA I tried to incorporate Bill and Alan's feedback into this language, I've taken out the part of commitment discussed yesterday all that language came out, I included the language regarding inherit conflict that was to reflect the conflict we identified yesterday between ICANN as the IANA functions operator, serving the both the role as a provider but also being in the role of ratifying body for global policy. My understanding was that we want to make very clear in this proposal we are suggesting that an amendment to the ASO MoU be made that would remove ICANN from the ratifying role, with other respects the gPDP would remain the same. Something that I did add because in reviewing the ASO MoU, it wouldn't necessarily become Global Policy upon each the RIR ratifying the proposed comment text but the ASO AC which still have to just review

the process by which we did so and then at that point the proposed policy text would become global policy, so that what I tried to capture on this.

IO thank your for incorporating Bill and Alan comments to the text.

AB (chat) I am comfortable with the new text about removing the ICANN Board's role in gPDP ratification.

IO I think Andrei had some comments on the text

MA I think Andrei's comments were in regards the original text, I think his concerns are addressed in the new text

IO lets confirm with Andrei.

NN I'm not going to try to speak on behalf of Andrei, I agree with the fact that ICANN has a dual role is not something new that we just discovered we were very aware of this. I think the concern raised here because ICANN has this dual role, which we don't want to mix policy issue with the IANA functions, I think because of that, is important to keep them separate. The other thing, I'm little concern, in fact very concern, are we saying that the crisp group is proposing an amendment to the ASO MoU, if so I'm actually asking if that is under our mandate, I don't think that follow due process. I have two concerns one is mixing policy into this, which is exactly what we don't want to do. My second point is, I'm afraid we are undermining the existing bottom up process within the RIR structure by adding to the CRISP mandate that we are proposing a change to the ASO MoU I don't think is in the scope of this group, I don't think is in the scope of the document. It doesn't mean I don't think the motivation behind putting this text is correct I totally agree with the concern that motivate inserting this text but I don't think this is the vehicle for that. I hope that was clear.

IO we should not mix policy with operations. We shouldn't give the message that the NTIA has any kind of involvement or authority over the gPDP. This is very important. The second, as CRISP Team, are we in the position to propose changes in the global policy? We have to be very careful wording this how we are phrasing to make sure I doesn't sound we try to make changes without using the usual processes.

AB yes, I think the CRISP team mandate is to propose changes to the way the RIR interact with the IANA operator, and also possible with ICANN so I think suggesting changes to the existing documents is within the scope of what the CRISP can do however we need to be careful that changes have consensus from our communities. We can't bypass the bottom up process but I think we can suggest changes in almost anything.

IO I think this address NN concern of your second point.

NN I'm afraid I disagree. I don't actually think is in our mandate to propose changes on how IANA operates. I think we are suppose to define the relationship with the IANA operator, maybe we need to have a discussion on those things first because there are principles on what we are trying to achieve here. My second point I really don't think is the CRISP group is the correct body or the correct channel for changes to the ASO MoU I don't want to be bureaucratic about things, the reason we follow correct process and

channels are because we are a bottom-up transparent inclusive community, we need to show that in all the way we interact with various bodies. The CRISP group is the wrong avenue to do this, I think we are undermining the exact bottom process that we are trying to strengthen through this process.

IO firstly I think your question was that do we need to cover gPDP as a part of the CRISP team proposal considering the part we have to focus on something related to the IANA functions, that was your first point, the second point if I understood it correctly by mentioning about the MoU ASO in the document it would seem to imply that the CRISP team is coming up with changes that actually is something that we have to change through the usual bottom up process and it's not the CRISP team to make decision over this it would seem we are not actually respecting the bottom process that should be developed from the community is that a fair understanding of your point Nurani.

NN As a point clarification, I'm not asking the gPDP being discuss here, I'm trying to make a point here on the dual role if ICANN in the gPDP and the IANA operator and that it's more important to separate both things. Otherwise you were more eloquent on what I was trying to say here.

IO I agree we want to separate these roles.

IO I have an observation on ICANN having dual role. I'm not sure if it should be considered a controversial or conflicting role, in terms of the RIR, the RIR is the same at least in the case of APNIC, the policy itself is developed by the community but APNIC EC is the one actually approving the final policy, may be different in other regions, and APNIC yet provide the number resource services, APNIC exchanges contracts with their members that would say APNIC has a dual role.

PR (chat) this is not across the RIR.

IO Understood it may be different depending on the RIR. Anybody has any comment or suggestion on addressing this point.

CN can I ask a question and maybe offer a possible solution. A question for NN where do you see the forum from that discussion would take place, the potential solution is that perhaps we can delay the references from this document, addressing this way, this submission is really intended to be high level description of SLA I think we all agreed in that, and I think me might focus maybe minutia detailed issues that doesn't necessarily have to come out now in this document, one of the potential solution could be that there is termination clause in the SLA that says for example if ICANN board make a decision related to gPDP in a way is inconsistent with the bottom up, transparent accountable way for example then that give us the right to terminate the contract that is potential solution a way out for us and that doesn't need to be said in the document that could came out when we negotiate the contract.

IO that sounds a reasonable solution for me.

JS we could identify that as a possible issue be looked and resolve by the proper channels, we see the conflict; we should recommend review it and correct it by the

correct process.

IO sounds a reasonable possibility.

AB I'd like to correct something I said earlier, I thought we could change almost anything but I re-read the RFP I noticed that in section II it asks about the existing pre transition sources of policies that would include ICANN board, but in section III it asks about propose changes is asking propose changes only to the oversight mechanisms not to the sources of policies so what I said earlier is wrong we should not be changing the way the policy is made perhaps can be done somewhere else but I changed my mind whether or not can be done here.

PR In light what NN and AB mentioned I have to say is out of the scope of this group and if you feel is something you want to identify from this process I think is smart to go back to your communities and identifying there. It should be taken through the community processes. We are looking to the oversight contract not the gPDP. We must remain focus.

IO I would like to confirm about an idea suggested by JS. When we send out announcement to the communities, would it be worth mentioning this issue.

PR I'm not comfortable CRISP team making references to this. I think this should be brought forward to the communities. I think this is a much better avenue, I'm not seeing a collective recommendation.

JS (Chat) outside the document works as well and each of us taking it back to our community is one way as well.

IO May be the way forward it that the document doesn't include the observations about global PDP and each of us who see the need to share with the community can do it, when receiving questions related to this issue in your community but not proactively share it as CRISP team.

IS makes sense to me.

MA (chat) then it appears there is consensus that I can take it out of the draft.

IO I think we can remove the whole paragraph on global PDP and we focus in what affects the IANA functions. We are done with this part.

No objections observed on removing the paragraph from Section III on global PDP.

IO lets move to the second revision proposed by Andres.

AP I have seen on the list that Andrei said that some of his concern where not addressed here. I proposed Andrei to provide a third version. At the moment I believe we are ok with the paragraph included in the document.

NN Andrei's mail that came in in the list it was not about this paragraph is was about another text; may I propose to move to that text? It's a totally different issue.

AP if you are suggesting moving on, are you ok with the paragraph on the Review Committee.

MA (chat) I believe the question is if anyone has objection to the suggested text before we move on.

NN (chat) which part of the text are we talking about?

IO the paragraph that AP refers is second paragraph in page 8.

NN I'm clear now I thought we were going back to the previous topic. NN I think you managed to capture the discussion very well we are comfortable with that if LACNIC feels addressing their concern we are happy to accept the text.

IO anybody has any comments?

CN (chat) I'm happy with it.

No objection observed on text provided by AP about Review Committee to be included in Section III.

IO I'd like to request MA to add Andrei text on references to the IETF.

IO Regarding the text suggested by Andrei on overlap with IETF for Section I, I'd like to request MA to add Andrei text on references to the IETF. This text had been agreed on the CRISP Team mailing list.

MA no problem in includes them in the next version.

MA no problem in includes them in the next version.

PR It's important to include references to other bodies.

AB Paul already said what I wanted to say.

IO I think we have support for this.

3. Final check on the initial draft

AB: Suggested to leave this topic to the second draft and suggested to clarify in the announcement that there will be future changes.

AB, MA and IO volunteered to work on this.

NN- She suggested to maintain the discussion on the global mailing list. Each region may discuss as well in their own regional mailing lists and then come up all the information and comments to the global mailing list. In addition, all the CRISP team members should encourage each community to participate in the global mailing list.

JS: Agreed and added that it's important to encourage people to use the official NRO list. "We should make sure that the feedback from the communities is posted in the NRO list."
